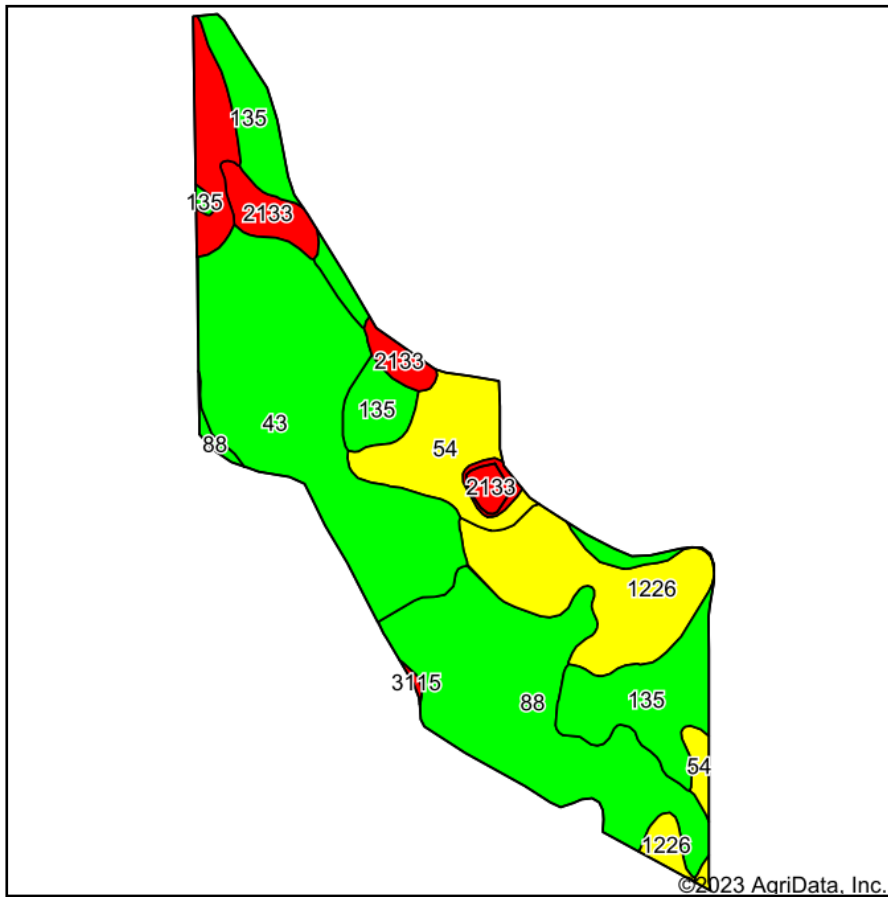
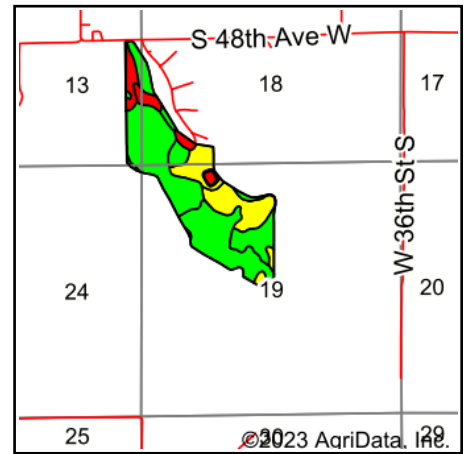


Tillable Soils Map
